ARIZONA PRB-1: House Bill, HB 2615; Emergency communication; antennas; accommodation

State Representative Nancy McLain submitted our Arizona PRB-1 bill on Tuesday January 26th. It passed the Military Affairs and Public Safety (MAPS) committee on Feb 17th and passed the rules committee on March 8th. It failed the 2nd reading before the house. Rep Murphy moved that the House reconsider HB2615 on Wednesday, March 31, 2010. After a big letter/email writing campaign by all of you, it passed on March 31st. Thank you for writing your representative, we were able to turn 15 no votes into yes votes. As of March 31st it is in the senate and it was read first on April 1st and then on April 5th. 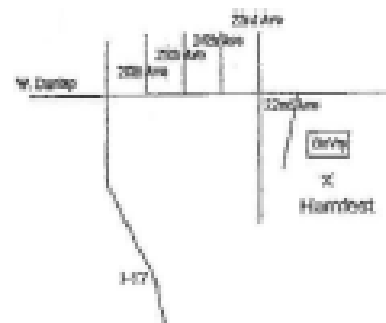
