HB2287 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS; ANTENNAE; ACCOMMODATION

After much discussion with the experts and counsel at the ARRL, Rep Nancy McLain introduced HB2887 on January 28th to the Arizona State Legislature. The bill directs municipalities, boards of supervisors, and community associations, for purposes of zoning regulations, to provide "...reasonable heights and dimensions...for accommodation of amateur radio station emergency service communications antennae and structures." The bill can be found by searching for HB2287 at azleg.gov. Our bill has already been read in the house twice and it will be before the Military Affairs & Public Safety Committee this coming Wednesday Feb 16th.

At the same time the ARRL introduced a federal bill, H81, "The Amateur Radio Emergency Communications Enhancement Act of 2011" http://www.arrl.org/hr-81 "To promote and encourage the valuable public service, disaster relief, and emergency communications provided on a volunteer basis by licensees of the Federal Communications Commission in the Amateur Radio Service, by undertaking a study of the uses of amateur radio for emergency and disaster relief communications, by identifying unnecessary or unreasonable impediments to the deployment of Amateur Radio emergency and disaster relief communications, and by making recommendations for relief of such unreasonable restrictions so as to expand the uses of amateur radio communications in Homeland Security planning and response."






